class, unless you go home and put double effort to study what you missed in the class. This is a small example of what happens when we do not arrive on time for any activity. The time, money and any other resource that we spend for the completion of the activity, all become unproductive. Punctuality as a habit embeds a host of other values. When you respect the fact that you have to be on time to meet someone or to be part of a class, it is taken that you respect the other person or the commitment. Respect for others is the bedrock of every

society. When we respect others, we become tolerant and are able to appreciate the good in the other person/s. We need this virtue in India in the present times, more than ever before. Considering that we are a country with diversity, we need values and ethics that promote unity in thought and action. So, can you imagine what a
