Subject: Recognition Certificate for the School under sub-rule 4 Of Rule 12 of Karnataka Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2010 and under Section 18 of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009.

3. As per the proposal by Chairman / Correspondent / Secretary, Model Education Centre, #12, 9TH "A" Cross, New Town, Yelahanka, Bengaluru-560064.

With reference to your application and subsequent correspondence with the School / Inspection by Departmental Officers, I convey the grant of provisional recognition to the **M.E.C PUBLIC SCHOOL, #12, 9TH "A" CROSS, NEW TOWN, YELAHANKA, BANGALURU-64.** for Classes 1st Std to 8th Std for a period of Three Years and subject to fulfillment of following conditions:

1. This is a provisional grant of recognition under the RTE Act and Rules and is not extendable beyond Class VIII.
2. The School shall abide by all the provisions of the RTE Act 2009, and the RTE Rules 2010, referred here in.
3. The School shall admit in Class I, to the extent of 25% of the strength of the Class, Children belonging to weaker sections and disadvantaged groups in the neigh bourhood and provide free and compulsory education till completion of elementary education. Provided that if the school admits children in Pre-Primary Classes also, the school shall follow these norms. The children so admitted shall not be discriminated from the rest of the children or segregated or treated separately in any manner.
4. For the children referred in paragraph 3, the school shall be reimbursed as per Section 12(2) of the Act. In order to receive such reimbursements, the school shall open and maintain a separate bank account which is subject to audit by the department.
5. The Society / School shall not collect any capitation fee or voluntary donations from the parents of children at any time either during admission or during the course of the academic year. The school shall collect only tuition and other fee as approved by the department. The scale of fee shall be notified by the school and displayed prominently in the school premises.
6. The school shall not subject the child or the parents to any screening procedure including and test and interview.
7. Admissions shall be made only during the period notified by the department.

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8. The school shall not deny admission to any child.
 - (i) For Lack of age proof.
 - (ii) On grounds of Caste, Religion, Race or Place of Birth, Language.
 - (iii) If admission is sought subsequent to the extended period of admission.
9. The School shall ensure:
 - a) No child admitted shall be held back in any class or expelled from school till completion of elementary education in a school.
 - b) No child shall be subjected to physical punishment or mental harassment.
 - c) No child is required to pass any Board Examination till the completion of elementary education.
 - d) Every child completing elementary education shall be awarded a certificate as laid down Under Rule 21.
 - e) The school shall also admit children with special needs / special children as per provisions of the Act.
 - f) The teachers recruited have minimum qualification as is prescribed for elementary school teachers in the RTE Rules.
 - g) The salary and allowance payable to and the terms and conditions of service of teachers shall be as prescribed by the State Government and the salaries are paid to teachers only through bank.
 - h) The teachers perform the duties prescribed under section 24(1) of the Act and Rule 17 of the RTE Rules and shall not engage themselves in private tuitions for monetary considerations.
10. The school shall follow the curriculum and text books of the academic authority to which it is affiliated.
11. The school shall admit student in proportion to the facilities available in the school as prescribed in the Section 19 of the Act.
12. The school shall maintain the norms and standards as specified in Section 19 of the Act, the deficiencies noticed by the department staff are given in the annexure.
13. The school shall not run any unauthorized Classes / Sections either within the school premises or outside.
14. The school buildings and other infrastructure facilities should not be used either during day or night for any commercial activities or for political and non-education activities.
15. The school shall not be run for profit to any individual or group or association of persons.
16. The accounts of the school are audited by a Chartered Accountant and a copy of such audited statements is sent to the DDPI / BEO by end of June every year.

Special Note:-

1. The guidelines issued regarding the safety measures of the children must be strictly followed and if any damage or violation in this regard is noticed the Management and the school is held responsible.
2. The Management has to compulsorily register the school details in the department Website.

CERTIFICATE

Certified that the Education Department of the Government of the State of Karnataka has no objection to the affiliation of MEC Public School, CA Site No. 12, 9th Cross, Yelahanka Upanagar, Bangalore North, Bangalore-560 106 run by Model Education Center, CA Site No. 12, 9th Cross, Yelahanka Upanagar, Bangalore North, Bangalore-560 106 to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

2. This No Objection Certificate is issued subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) The relevant rules applicable in this regard and the instruction issued by Government in Education Department in this regard shall be followed by the management.
- (2) This No Objection Certificate shall not be construed as a letter of permission, recognition or registration to start a school. A School shall not be started until and unless the CBSE, as the case may be, accords affiliation. Starting of pre-primary, primary or secondary classes merely on the basis of this NOC without obtaining prior formal affiliation to CBSE, is not permissible. However, the institution can start pre-primary, primary, secondary classes after registering and obtaining recognition under the Karnataka Education Act and the rules made thereunder till it obtains affiliation to CBSE. In such cases, it has to comply with the medium of instruction policy of the State Government, namely, mother tongue or Kannada should be medium of instruction from standard 1 to 5. If any institution starts pre-primary, primary or secondary classes without prior registration and recognition under the State Act and the rules and also without prior affiliation to the CBSE it would be in violation of the provisions of the Karnataka Education Act and rules and will be liable for penal action under the said Act/rules.
- (3) After obtaining affiliation to CBSE, the management shall teach Kannada language compulsorily as a subject.
- (4) The management shall provide infrastructure as per the norms prescribed.
- (5) The management shall not collect any donation from the students or their parents/guardians and collect only the fees prescribed by Government from time to time as per the provisions of the Karnataka Educational Institutions (Abolition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 or as prescribed by the CBSE, as the case may be.
- (6) Children of those belonging to the All India Services/Central Services liable to inter-state transfer, migrants from out of State who are temporarily put up in the State of Karnataka/employees of all India

level business/commercial and industrial establishments and Anglo-Indians shall get preference in admissions.

- (7) Admission to pre- primary stage should be done in the month of April every year.
- (8) The NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE along with the conditions subject to which the same has been issued should be exhibited in a conspicuous place in the office of the school next to the notice board for the benefit of general public.
- (9) For starting the pre-primary school (Nursery / LKG / UKG etc.,) the management shall obtain prior permission by registering the same in accordance with the Karnataka Educational Institutions (Classification and Registration) Rules, 1997.
- (10) Any other conditions that may be imposed in future.
- (11) The management shall extend all co-operation to the officials of the State Education Department whenever they visit their schools for inspection even after getting affiliation to CBSE.
- (12) In case any of the conditions mentioned above is violated, the officers concerned in the Department of Public Instruction shall be free to take action as per law and Government of Karnataka shall be free to withdraw the NOC given by it.

3. The school shall not claim any grant-in-aid ever.

4. This No Objection Certificate shall be valid for a period two years from the date of issue.

5. The application seeking issue of this NOC was received on 03.02.2010 and the same was processed and recommended by the Education Department.
